Nursery:

In Nursery we have been exploring our new home corner and the resources within it. We enjoyed talking to our visitor Miss Bugg about what she does around school and in our classrooms to keep us safe and clean.

Reception:

Year 1

In Year 1 this week we have been learning about length and height during maths lessons. The children have been using nonstandard units (e.g. cubes and hand spans) to measure objects. The children have also started to learn how to use a ruler when measuring in centimetres.

Year 5


Year 5 have been learning how to add and subtract decimals which have different amounts of decimal places. We have used our place value knowledge to help us solve different reasoning and problem solving questions.
