Nursery:



Coronavirus

We will continue to keep you informed with updates about coronavirus that we receive from the government. All letters have been uploaded to the website for your information and reference. Please let the office staff know if you are planning to travel to any of the places listed by the government and we will advise accordingly. We are preparing to provide work for your children should we be advised to close the school for any length of time. We will use Parent Hub to communicate with you regarding home learning. One of the announcements made by the government yesterday was that anyone with a new, persistent cough or a high temperature is advised to self-isolate for seven days. I would politely ask you to adhere to this advice and not send your child to school, if this is the case. Please let the school office know. Many thanks.

Hand washing

Soap is replenished in the toilet blocks each day when they are cleaned. We have been reminding children to respect our school property and use the facilities properly. Staff are regularly inspecting the toilet blocks to ensure that they are being used appropriately. We are constantly reminding everyone about the importance of washing hands as advised.

School Car Park and Parking

School Gates: We are awaiting repairs on our electric gates and as you may be aware at this moment they are having to remain open. There is no access to the school playground as all perimeter gates remain locked. Only in exceptional circumstances when permission has been granted that access is granted to the school car park. The school car park is for **staff only**. For health and safety and safeguarding reasons parents and carers are not permitted to use the car park unless it is for Newts within the designated times unless there are exceptional circumstances. Please drive slowly and take extra care if you are dropping off/picking up in a vehicle near school. Please be considerate to our neighbours when you are dropping off and picking up in a vehicle and do not block driveways. Please do not use the garage opposite school. Thank you for your cooperation.
