<u>Class Emails</u>

To contact your child's class teacher, you can use the email address shared with you. Emails received will not be responded to immediately due to teaching commitments. The emails will only be monitored during school day working hours and you will receive a reply within 3 days if this is required.

In line with our work/life balance policy, please note that emails will not be monitored or responded to during weekends or holidays. To share urgent information/updates please contact the school office, for example if there is a change to who is collecting your child.

Please also note that any emails received that breach the code of conduct will not be responded to and these will be passed to the senior leadership team.

<u>Music Update</u>

Next week, Rocksteady will be starting lessons on Mondays and Thursdays, If your child is in the 8:30am group please enter school through the Newts door (no earlier than 8:25am).

On Tuesday, we are really excited to be welcoming 'Get into Guitar' who will lead some workshops and an assembly for KS1 and KS2. If your child would like to learn how to play guitar, details will follow on Tuesday for you to sign up directly with the company. This is a great opportunity for small group lessons.

<u>Attendance</u>

If we do not know the reason why your child is absent, we will follow our procedures - this is a telephone call to all contacts and a home visit. If we are unable to make contact with you, we will refer the absence to the local authority.

Free School Meals

If your circumstances have changed you may be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) until Year 6, to apply for FSM please visit the website below:

There is no difference in how children order or receive meals if they are eligible for FSM. If your child receives FSM (Reception to Year 6) the school will also receive additional funding to support your child. Children in receipt of FSM also received confidential support with educational visits.

School meals for children in Reception and KS1 are FREE – this is part of the universal free school meal offer.

<u>School Uniform</u>

PENALTY NOTICE FINES FOR SCHOOL ATTENDANCE ARE CHANGING!

With the introduction of the New National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force on 19th August 2024.

PENALTY NOTICES WILL BE ISSUED FOR

Term time leave: Penalty Notice Fines will be issued for Term Time Leave of 5 or more consecutive days

10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period: A Penalty Notice may be considered/issued when a pupil has had 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week* period.

*School Week's

PER PARENT/PER CHILD

Penalty Notice Fines will continue to be issued per parent per child.

For example: 3 Siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

FIRST OFFENCE

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for a Term Time Holiday or Irregular School Attendance the Penalty Notice will be charged at:

£160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days of issue, reducing to £80 if paid within 21 days**.

SECOND OFFENCE (within 3 years of the First Offence)

Where it is deemed appropriate to issue a second Penalty Notice to the same parent for the same pupil within 3 years of the first notice, the second Penalty Notice will be charged at:

£160 if paid within 28 days (no reduced fee for paying early).

(**Unpaid Penalty Notice's after 28 days may result in a parental prosecution)

THIRD OFFENCE (within 3 years of the First Offence)

On the third time that an offence is committed for either a Term Time Holiday and / or Irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, the case may proceed straight to Parental Prosecution under the Single Justice Procedure. If found guilty of the offence of 'Failure to send a child to school' the Magistrates can impose a fine up to £1000.
